The country is also of interest to physicians, as Hippocrates, referred to as the "Father of Medicine" in recognition of his lasting contributions to the field founded the Hippocratic School of Medicine in Ancient Greece. This intellectual school revolutionized medicine, establishing it as a discipline distinct from other fields with which it had traditionally been associated (theurgy and philosophy), thus establishing medicine as a profession. The Hippocratic Oath, even today, serves as a foundation for other, similar oaths and laws that define good medical practice and morals.
